**Advanced Live Hacking: Methodologies and Demonstrations of Web Application Hacks By Conrad Clark
Wednesday, July 18, 2007 at 06:00 PM**

Web applications by nature are not static. Content is continually being altered and new features are added, in some instances on a very frequent basis. Each time the Web application is changed, a risk is imposed that the application will not be secure. Even the simplest of changes could produce a vulnerability that may pose a major threat to the assets of the company, or just as important, information about a company's customers.

It's been estimated that three-fourths of today's successful system hacks are perpetrated not via network security flaws, but by entering directly through the "front door" - exploiting vulnerabilities in customer-facing Web applications. The hacker has evolved. Reality is that Web sites and Web applications are hacked with frightening ease. By taking advantage of the public access to a company through the Internet and using it to subvert your applications, hackers can gain easy access into your company's sensitive backend data. Firewalls and intrusion detection systems (IDS) will not stop such attacks because hackers using the Web application layer are not seen as intruders.

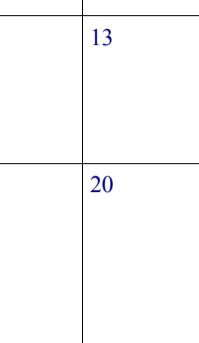
This session demonstrates how to defend against common attacks at the Web application layer with examples covering Web application hacking methods such as SQL Injection, Cross Site Scripting, Parameter Manipulation, Session Hijacking, and LDAP Injection. In addition, the session covers the techniques and processes that can be easily implemented into the application development lifecycle to ensure protection from such common attacks without requiring security expertise.
